Student Loans

Together with the Kreditanstalt für Wiederaufbau (KfW) and the Federal Office of Administration, the BMBF grants the [Education Loan](#). Another possibility is the [Student Loan](#) granted by the KfW. Both loans are granted independently of income.

In cooperation with Chancen eG, we also offer the Reverse Generation Contract (UGV). With this model, CHANCEN eG assumes the study costs. In return, the students commit themselves to enabling the next generation to do the same: as soon as they are in employment, they pay back a percentage of their income to finance subsequent study places. Currently, CHANCEN eG supports applicants from the countries: Australia, Canada, Israel, Japan, New Zealand, Norway, South Korea, Switzerland, and USA.

Scholarships

Karlshochschule has a cooperation with the program weltwärts which is a program for volunteer services funded by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ). Weltwärts promotes global learning and receives volunteers from abroad to volunteer for German organizations in Germany.

In addition of financing your studies through public grants or loans, there are some public and private scholarships available. These include scholarships through the federally funded "Begabtenförderungswerke". However, most of these foundations have the same citizenship and residence requirements specified by BAföG. Some of them have special programs for international students, though!
