An example of how to use the Electronic Journals Library (EZB)

Chou, Kee-Lee; Chow, Nelson W. W.; Chi, Iris: Leisure participation amongst Hong Kong Chinese older adults. In: Ageing and Society, 2004, Vol. 24 (4); pp. 617-629.

Please go through the following steps:

- Go to the library home page and select '**Elektronische Zeitschriftenbibliothek (EZB)**' (*electronic journal library*).
- In the search bar type in part of your article – for example the **Title of the Journal**. This time we will use '**Ageing and Society**'.
- A search list will show and you will see a yellow and a red light behind the first title. This means that you found only part of the text.
- Click on the link [Ageing and Society](#) and select: **Zu den Volltexten: Nationallizenz : Jg. 1 (1981) - Nicht die letzten 2 Jahrgänge** (*Full-text view: national license: Year 1 (1981) – ignore the last 2 years*)
- As the mentioned article is from the year **2004**, you can click on its link and land on the journal's homepage where the full text is available.
- From the many links provided in the menu select '**Back Issues**', find the year **2004**, search for the volume **Heft 4** (*issue 4*) and the pages where the article is to be found **Seite 617-629** (*page 617-629*). Below the article select 'View PDF' to download and open the article in full.
